# Creating an Account

# Step 1: Requesting an Account

• To create an account, click on "Request Account" and fill out the following information.


## Step 2: Inputting Information

- Ensure that your information matches the registered information given to UBC.
- Enter your official UBC email or the email address you use for other UBC activities.
- User IDs are used each time you sign into the system and can be up to 30 characters in length and contain letters and numbers.
  - Tip! Use your CWL username to help easily remember your user ID.

## Step 3: Selecting Courses

- Scroll through the list of courses and click on the courses in which you are enrolled.
- Make sure that your course number, as well as your professor information, is correct.
  - $\circ~$  This can be confirmed on your class schedule on SSC or on your class syllabus.



#### Step 4: Confirming Account

- Click on "Request Account" and check your email for the confirmation email
- This will contain your login information. Keep this information somewhere safe.

#### Step 5: Completing Pre-screening Survey

- Upon entering the system, you will be prompted to complete a pre-screening survey.
  - By completing this pre-screening survey, you will earn your first half a credit towards your course grade and will become eligible for more studies.
- If there is a backlog of students completing this survey, you can skip it and come back at another time to complete it.
- During the pre-screening survey, your HSP identification number will be created.
  - This is the first four digits of your student number, two digits of your birth month and two digits of your birthday.
  - $\circ~$  For example, if your student ID is 1234567, and your birthday is August 1, your ID would be 1234 + 08 + 01 = 12340801.

# Homepage and Features

## Right side of the dashboard

- *Credits Overview:* Summarizes how many credits you have earned and how many credits you have pending.
  - *Pending credits:* Mean that the researcher has yet to assign you your credits, this will be done shortly.
- Upcoming appointments: Lists studies you have signed up for but have yet to complete.

#### Left side of the dashboard

- Study Sign-Up: Find the list of available studies.
- My Schedule & Credits: View/change/reassign credits and cancel studies.
- My Profile: View/edit your profile information.
- FAQs: Frequently Asked Questions.
